'Institutional Fees Suspended

NPRC's Board of Trustees voted and approved a two-year suspension of institutional fees charged for academic courses. Institutional fees are additional charges to students based on the number of credits in which students enroll each academic term.

NPRC Inks Agreement with Commonwealth University

NPRC and Commonwealth University (Bloomsburg, Lock Haven, Mansfield universities) signed a guaranteed transfer agreement, effective fall 2022, in a ceremony held at NPRC's Administrative Center in Warren on Thursday, July 28 at 2:00 p.m.

The agreement provides transferability of many NPRC credits to the integrated universities of Commonwealth University. It also includes guaranteed transfer opportunities for specific NPRC associate degrees directly into four CU bachelor's degree programs with no loss of credit for qualifying students. NPRC's Associate of Arts degrees (Liberal Studies and Social Sciences) and Associate of Science degrees (Business Administration and Criminal Justice) are the four degrees included.

To support the guaranteed admission for eligible transfer students, renewable scholarships of up to \$5,000 for qualifying students are available. To be eligible, a student must have earned a minimum of 30 NPRC-specific credits and graduated with a GPA of 2.0 or higher.

Local Business Invests in Employees through Scholarship Program

Superior Tire and Rubber Corporation has established a scholarship program to provide opportunities for their employees, their employee's spouses, and their employee's children to enroll in courses at NPRC at no cost. Presently, several Superior Tire employees have co-op positions between the Warren County Career Center and Superior Tire, an agreement the business hopes will eventually transition these employees to full-time and allow them to become an NPRC student.

To formally acknowledge the scholarship program agreement between NPRC and Superior Tire, a signing between NPRC and Superior Tire and a check presentation of \$10,000.00 for future students' education took place on Tuesday, July 12 at Superior Tire's headquarters in Warren.

Superior Tire and Rubber Corporation President and CEO, Hank LeMeur, shared with NPRC that, "The overriding objective is we want to offer a path to growth for our employees and their families. The objective is to help make our employees more productive, our company more productive, and make it more fulfilling. One of the first people we had go through NPRC was not the employee, but their wife. It helped her improve her skills and move onto a job that gave her a path to a more fulfilling career."
