




NPRC ADDS TIOGA COUNTY TO ITS FOOTPRINT

Tioga County was officially added to the institution's service region effective July 11, 2023. With this approval granted by the Pennsylvania Department of Education, NPRC's service region has expanded to 10 counties. Prior to this addition, the College officially began offering classes in Tioga County in January 2023 as Northern Tioga School District (110 Ellison Road, Elkland, PA) and Southern Tioga School District (310 Morris Street, Blossburg, PA) welcomed NPRC to use their facilities for academic courses.

Local high school students may also contact their guidance counselor for more information on early entry (dual enrollment) classes with NPRC.

The fall 2023 term has been an exciting one for NPRC. Not only did the College return 40 students — 60 new students were also welcomed. In all, the College has 100 students enrolled for the fall term across 17 of their 27 classroom locations. Our dual enrollment student population now stands at 23 students. To kick-off the term on a high note, each of our learners this fall was welcomed by members of the NPRC team surprising them with goodie bags on their first day.

NPRC PROCTOR SPOTLIGHT


MARISSA CERVONE-GILSON

AND TRAINING SPECIALIST




LILY DOW
