

NPRC SELECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN VIEWPOINT

The Viewpoint short-form documentary series hosted by Dennis Quaid has selected Northern Pennsylvania Regional College for an exclusive opportunity to be featured on national public television. The upcoming season of the series, titled 'Leaders in the Future of Community College Education,' will feature the impact community colleges make in the United States.

Viewpoint is a short-form documentary series that is distributed to public television stations in all 50 U.S. states. The series strives to make meaningful documentaries and inspire audiences to act. Viewpoint cultivates each segment with an approach that adds value to people's lives and aims to change the way people view educational programming. One of its goals is to enlighten the audience by delivering diverse informational and educational documentaries covering various issues and topics.


NPRC OFFERS WORK-READY SKILL SET PROGRAMS

Northern Pennsylvania Regional College announced this spring the addition of Work-Ready Skillsets in business, criminal justice, and social sciences. These skill sets will be offered starting in August 2024.

These skill sets can be achieved in under a year's time (two to three terms). They are non-degree, short-term options for students, but the credits can also be applied toward an associate degree at NPRC. If students choose to pursue a degree, they can request up to two skill sets within their program curriculum.

These Work-Ready Skillsets were added by NPRC to help students earn the skills necessary in specific areas to begin an entry-level career or advance their careers. They are perfect for businesses and organizations wanting to invest in their employees' development and prefer a quicker return-on-investment for their employees.

Some courses will require regular remote attendance, while others can be completed at student's own pace.

NPRC X NAIP: EMPOWERING FUTURE PROFESSIONALS

Northern Pennsylvania Regional College NPRC launched a collaboration with the National Association of Insurance Professionals, Inc. (NAIP) that began a virtual insurance agent training program in April.

The seven-week program addresses the skills gap affecting employment prospects across Pennsylvania, while this strategic partnership aims to guide participants to gain necessary soft skills, workplace proficiencies, and industry credentials crucial for forging successful careers in the insurance and financial services industries.

The program also offers a unique opportunity for participants to earn a weekly stipend while working to become a capable financial and insurance professional. Program completers will leave being equipped for roles in banks, credit unions, call centers, and insurance agencies. To qualify to take part in the program, learners must be at least 17 years of age and fluent in the English language.

She will be enrolling at Pennsylvania Western University – Clarion to major in nursing, with her goal being to one day work in the emergency room or intensive-care unit. The credits she earned as an early entry student at NPRC will give her not just a foundation of college learning heading to Penn West, but also credits that can transfer to help make this next step more affordable.

"I am very grateful for the opportunity I had to be a student at NPRC. They have been great at making sure I have the credits I need for college to help me cut down on the classes I would have to take later."
