


NPRC AWARDED DUAL ENROLLMENT GRANT

The Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) announced in April that the Shapiro Administration has awarded \$14 million in grant funding to 15 public institutions of higher education. Northern Pennsylvania Regional College (NPRC) was a local recipient of \$1,000,000. This funding was awarded to enable more high school students to enroll in dual credit programs across the Commonwealth, giving them more opportunities to chart their own course and prepare for successful careers.

NPRC will make dual enrollment courses free for the 2025-26 and 2026-27 academic years and will expand offerings in science, technology, engineering, math, and continuing education coursework. Additionally, the College plans to expand course offerings through our Runways Program and asynchronous courses, develop career pathways and work-ready certificates to be earned for students while still in high school, develop certificates in emerging technical areas, and continue advancing towards accreditation with the National Alliance of Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships (NACEP).


COMMENCEMENT SPEAKERS

Two NPRC alumni served as the speakers for the 2025 Commencement Ceremony held on Saturday, May 17 in Corry at Enchanted Beginnings. Kara Haight, a December 2024 graduate in liberal studies, served as the student speaker, while Birttany Grajek, a spring 2024 graduate in early childhood education, served as the commencement speaker.

Haight began her journey with NPRC in the fall 2021 term. She came to the College as a homeschooled student but found the transition from homeschool to NPRC's welcoming community to be a smooth one. She is pursuing writing, while working part-time roles at the Warren and Youngsville Public Libraries. Presently, Haight is working on a historical fiction novel for young readers and is connecting with a publisher this fall to present her work.

Grajek is shaping young minds in her career as a lead teacher for two-year-olds at the Meadville Children's Center. Before returning to the workforce in 2024, she had stepped away from her career to improve her health. Throughout 2023 and into the early months of 2024, Grajek faced what seemed to be a chronic illness. However, after months of searching for answers, it was discovered that she had thyroid cancer and needed surgery. Despite all she was juggling, her grades never slipped as she graduated from NPRC with a 4.0 grade-point average and honors.

NPRC AND CNB WAGNER PARTNERSHIP

NPRC and CNB Wagner Enterprise, LLC have partnered to help fulfill the need for more commercial driver's licensed (CDL) drivers. Classes for CDL Class A licenses will be held at CNB Wagner's range located in Forest County at 727 Route 36 in Tionesta. The cost of the program is estimated at \$4,625.00.

CNB Wagner has a five-part process for learners, which includes completing the online Entry-Level Driver Training (ELDT) Theory Course on students own time, passing a physical examination by a healthcare provider, obtaining a CDL permit from the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), completing entry-level driver training at their range, and testing after completing the 40 hours of training time at their range. The online training that can be completed on learners' own time and pace paired with the one-on-one instruction time helps to make this program convenient for learners.

Instructor of Social Work, Carolyn Perales, has extensive education in the field. She earned a Bachelor's of Science in Social Work and a Bachelor's of Arts in Psychology from Slippery Rock University and a Master of Science in Social Work with a specialization in mental health from the University of Louisville. She is also a Licensed Social Worker (LSW) in Pennsylvania and an Accredited Case Manager – Social Worker (ACM-SW) through the American Case Management Association.

She currently works full-time in healthcare as a social work manager in her native Erie County, working for a hospital system in the neuroscience unit with an interdisciplinary team of doctors, nurses, physical and occupational therapists, and other medical professionals. Previously, she served as a mental health therapist at a residential treatment facility and specialized in trauma-informed care. While her full-time work was certainly fulfilling, there was something missing; she was not sharing her knowledge with upcoming social workers.

Harry Snyder, a resident of Ridgway, completed his commercial driver's license (CDL) training this spring in St. Marys through the truck driver training partnership between PA Pride, LLC and NPRC. Snyder is employed by the Ridgway Borough as a wastewater treatment operator, and earning a CDL will help him in his everyday job driving sewage plant dump trucks, as well as allow him to earn additional income if he chooses.

Snyder chose NPRC's program because it was close to home, but along the way, he realized that this CDL program was more than just an opportunity in his native Elk County. A workplace accident forced Snyder to push back his original start date. As he recovered, the College accommodated Snyder with a new class once he was ready to begin his training. "I was unable to drive for a while. I'm thankful for NPRC stepping up and communicating with PA Pride to coordinate me into a new section of the class. They made it easy for me."

Snyder shares with others that one of the keys to success in the CDL program is going into the opportunity with an open mind. "Go into the course wanting to learn and you will succeed. The instructor I had was a great teacher and made it much easier to learn."
